# Risk Management Premium Credit Survey Results 2020-2021



United Educators (UE) surveys member schools each year about their five most pressing risk management concerns as part of our Risk Management Premium Credit (RMPC) program. This report provides a comparison of top risks identified by 272 UE independent and charter K-12 schools. It includes data collected from May 2020 through August 2021 and broken down by segment, highlights emerging risks, and tracks changes over three years. Strategies and UE resources for mitigating these risks are included to help schools handle what's most important now and anticipate what's coming next. Boarding schools and day schools have different risk profiles. Page 7 lists the top risks for these segments. Use the data below to start discussions about your school's top risks and benchmark against peers.

Learn more about the RMPC program, which enables eligible UE members to earn a credit toward their premium by mitigating critical risks.

Note: Percentages in this report reflect the percentage of respondents that identified a given risk. Because respondents listed five risks, these percentages don't add up to 100%.

### **COVID-19's Impact on This Report**

The pandemic persisted throughout the data collection period. UE researchers coded responses that mentioned "COVID-19," the "pandemic," or a closely related term as a risk related to "COVID-19 and Future Pandemics."

Many survey responses discussed risks that may have emerged from the pandemic but didn't mention COVID-19 by name. UE coded these risks based on the topic in the response. For example, a response stating "the shift to online learning" was coded as an "Online Learning" risk, despite the pandemic causing a shift to remote learning.

With at least six of the top 10 risks intertwined with COVID-19, this report shows how the pandemic amplifies many of the risks schools face.

### 01. Enrollment

Risks affecting new student admission and retention of current families

Risks emerging from pandemics now and in the future

### **Mitigation Efforts:**

- Develop school-wide public health response teams.
- Follow Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; state; and local public health guidelines.
- Transition to remote learning.
- Train on-campus employees on COVID-19 safety guidelines.
- Re-engineer building ventilation systems.

## 03. Data Security

Information technology risks such as data breaches, phishing, accidental disclosure of personal data, ransomware, and hacking

- Hire more data security staff.
- Conduct data security training.
- Create or update data governance strategy.
- Conduct third-party risk assessments.
- Update software and hardware systems.

## **O4.** Facilities and Deferred 35%Maintenance

Risks concerning outdated facilities and new construction, including inadequate facilities to achieve the school's mission

- Repurpose existing buildings for lowoccupancy use.

- Adjust new construction plans.
- Add new signage.
- Close unsafe spaces and areas under construction.

## **05. Operational Pressures**

Risks created by constraints on institutional processes and the school's business model

- · Access new debt.

### **06. Sexual Misconduct**

Risks related to unwanted behavior of a sexual nature, including employee and volunteer misconduct, sexual harassment, and sexual abuse of minors

- Increase mandatory training on policies, protocols, and boundary violations.

- · Evaluate school oversight.

## **07. Student Health** and Safety

### **Top Risks by Segment**


There are some notable differences between the top risks for day schools and boarding schools. Day schools are slightly more concerned about risks to their business operations, including Operational Pressures, Employee Misconduct, and Funding, while boarding schools see Student Health and Safety and Sexual Misconduct as greater risks.

### Respondents' Risk Management Role

Most survey respondents manage risk as one of several responsibilities. However, the percentage of respondents whose primary role is risk manager grew from 15% in the 2019-2020 survey to 27% in this year's survey.

This increase suggests that risk management is a growing strategic and operational necessity for independent schools.
